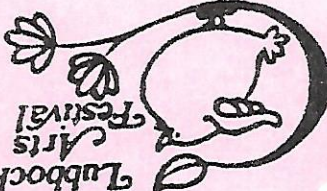

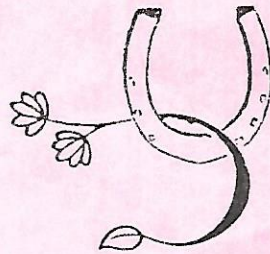

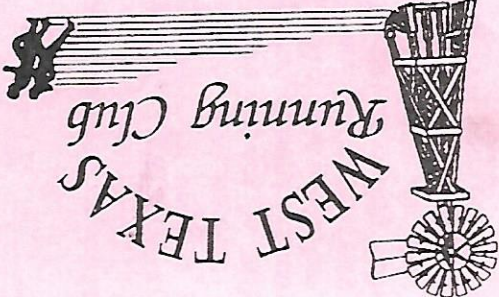

REPORT AND RESULTS

We could not have had a more beautiful day for the 1992 FLIGHT LINE RACES. It may have been a little warm to the serious competitors' liking, and the wind a little strong, but compared to some of the prior years it was very enjoyable. We had a record turnout this year, a total of 98 signed up, and 96 finished. This is second only to our July 4th FIRECRACKER RUN !! For the second time in a row the Half-Marathon course record was broken by another LCU runner, Haffis Banire, who qualified for the NAIIA Marathon with his time of 1:13:52. Finishing first for the second year in a row in the two mile was Milt Brownfield with a "quick" 10:59.

Once again, we had superb help from our volunteers who each get 13.1 miles credit in the CHALLENGE SERIES competition. Due to a miscommunication one of the water stop crews, manned by RAFB employees failed to show up at the critical 5 and 8 mile water station. However, Bill Roger, who had been assigned split-timer for 5 Miles, recognized the need and pulled double duty, also providing water. The Challenge Series

Many new members have joined since we last printed the guidelines for the W.T.R.C. "Challenge Series" competition in January. This is a program of volunteerism by which W.T.R.C. members serve each other while accumulating mileage and points in a quest for awards at the end of the year. There are awards for age division rankings, participation and total mileage. Members acquiring 66 or more miles by racing or serving as a non-running volunteer at one of the monthly club races will receive a W.T.R.C. "66 MILE" T-Shirt.

MEMBERSHIP

Along with being eligible in the "Challenge Series", paid membership entitles one to the \$ 4 entry fee at our monthly club races. To qualify as a "Family Membership" an additional \$ 2 per person must have been added to the first member's \$ 8 yearly dues, otherwise the \$ 5 non-member entry fee should be paid. A membership listing will be available for our future races, and anyone not paid-up by April 27, will be dropped off the "Challenge Series" listing found on page 5.
