AT THE TIME

press coverage of the athletic performances at the U.S. Olympic decathlon trials indicated that athletic performances have monetary implications. The TV announcer treated this aspect as if it were unusual in the realm of track and field.

At first, I concurred. Then later, upon reflection, I realized a similar aspect occurred at the 1972 Olympics in Munich but it went unrecognized at the time. At the time, there was no TV coverage of the monetary implication of a track and field athlete's athletic performance. At the time, no one foresaw Nike, Reebok, the "running boom", etc.

Frank Shorter won the gold medal in the marathon at Munich. I remember watching the television coverage of the marathon finish in the stadium (the only part covered by TV in those days and only because an American was winning).

The color commentator and analyst was Erich Segal. His credentials included a being author of a smash best seller Love Story, one of 1,384 Boston Marathon entrants that year (New York had 406), professor of English, and as fate would have it, even one of Frank Shorter's former professors.

ABC announcer Jim McKay stated that programming would cut away from the featured event (I've forgotten what it was) to cover an "unfolding, unusual situation in the marathon event", i.e. an American was leading.

The course of the Munich Olympic marathon finish included a circle of one final lap inside the stadium. Thus, the first runner through the stadium tunnel receives quite an ovation as they break out onto the stadium track.

At the time, Shorter's reaction was "Okay, here it comes. The roar that greets an Olympic marathon champion running into the stadium. And I got on the track and it was silent."

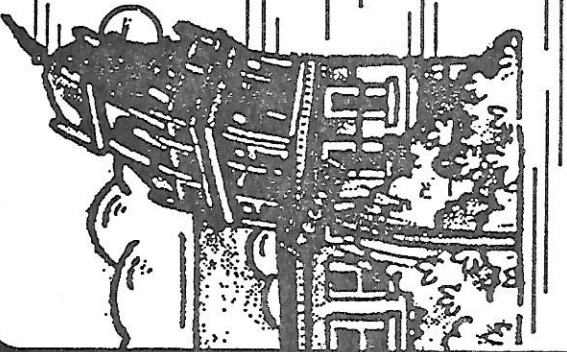
In 1972, after the first runner exited the tunnel to the stadium floor, the crowd began its ovation. Almost immediately Erich Segal began shouting "That's not Frank! He's an impostor! Get him off the track!". Sure enough, an impostor had jumped in and exited the tunnel before Shorter.

At the time, I thought what a shame. Some poor American trains forever. (My thinking then was that must be the minimum time to train to run 26+ miles). I also thought that this gold medal will go unnoticed in America. This American runner would fade back into oblivion and never be heard from again. The one moment of glory (the roar of the crowd) had been stolen by the impostor.

At the time Shorter "...assumed that viewers would take little interest ... in keeping with the American attitude that anyone from the U.S. who ran long distances did so because he couldn't do better at something else. 26.218 miles was a funny distance to begin with, and marathon runners were not to be taken seriously. They were nonconformists with strange daily habits."

The next issue of Life magazine had Shorter on the cover. And the rest, as they say, is history. So even at the 1972 Munich games press coverage of track and field performances had monetary implications.
