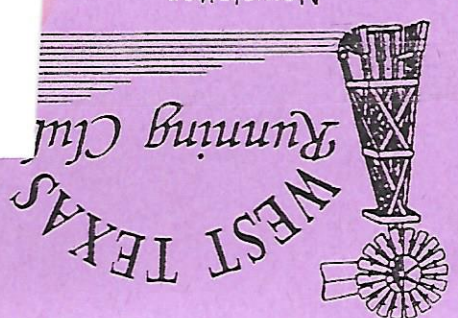

CROSS COUNTRY

The LISD Invitational Cross Country Meet this year drew nearly 2,000 participants coming from the top of Texas to south of San Angelo, west to El Paso and Ruidiso, New Mexico. This meet is very popular because of the Mae Simmons Park course, which we also use for our December Red Line Race. The Regional Meet is also held here later this fall so the coaches want to give their teams an introduction to the course.

Several club members fared very well in the results, especially Trey Jernigan, the overall winner of Division I in 16:05.2. His time was second only to the Division II winner's 15:57.2. Jay Truitt was 3rd in Division I behind Trey with a time of 16:14.4, which was better than the 2nd place finisher in Division II.

Among our girl finishers was Leslie Vardy, 4th in Division II with a time of 12:28.1, and in Division I, Angela Welsh finished 9th with a time of 12:34.1 followed closely in 10th place by Tara Jernigan with 12:35. Wendy Sullivan of Colorado City was 13th with a time of 12:53.3.

Running in Cyberspace

Devotees of world-class road racing and international track and field have a new source for news and results from these sports: the Internet. At any given moment, millions of computer users are literally navigating the globe, accessing information from remote sites via fiber-optic pathways, and amid this information explosion can be found a wealth of information on running. A casual perusal of a few running-related sites on the World Wide Web revealed the following:

- On September 24th, Kenyan Stephen Nyamu made road-racing history at the Richard S. Caliguirri City of Pittsburgh Great Race. He ran a world-best road 10k in 27:09, well under Mark Nenow's 27:22 performance at the 1984 Crescent City Classic.
- Former LCU standout James Bungei placed 5th overall in the El Paso-Juarez International 15K Classic on October 1. His time of 45:33 was 50 seconds behind the overall winner and earned him \$500. The great Welsh marathoner Steve Jones was first Master in 47:09.
- The legendary Bill Rodgers posted a 1:12.31 at the Motorola Half-Marathon in Schaumburg, IL on October 1, earning the 47-year-old 2nd place in the Master's competition.
- Phillimon Hanneck was on the track in Japan in September. He ran 5,000 meters in Kobe on Sept. 17 in 13:31.45. Two days earlier, in a meet in Tokyo, Hanneck ran 13:29.16 in a 5,000 meter race that was won by current world record holder Haile Gebrselassie.
- An Odessa, TX runner was a lucky winner in the Boston Athletic Association's October 10 lottery drawing for entry into the 1996 Boston Marathon. The October drawing was the second of three Lottery drawings created in response to the huge demand for entry into the race's historic 100th running. Earlier, an Amarillo runner was among 2,000 lucky winners selected in the first drawing on July 10. A complete list of winners' names was posted on the marathon's web site on the day following each drawing. A third and final drawing will be held on January 10.

What is most remarkable about the preceding information is how quickly it became available following each event. In fact, one web site devoted to the Boston Marathon provided a series of photographic images taken before, during, and after the 1995 race, with each image becoming accessible on the Internet within seconds of its capture. No longer must one wait for the next monthly running magazine or rely upon local newspapers to obtain race results.

In addition to race results, information on running clubs, equipment, and upcoming races can readily be found. There are web sites specifically devoted to the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games, USA Track & Field, and the 1995 Track & Field World Championships recently held in Sweden. One simply needs access to the Internet in order to visit these sites. Members of the Texas Tech community (students and faculty) can access the Internet through the university's VAX mainframe. Others who have a microcomputer and modem can gain access through commercial services (e.g., Prodigy, America OnLine, GEnie, CompuServe, Hub City Net) for a monthly fee.
