A total of 98 runners gathered this crisp morning for an invigorating jaunt around a plot of land which comprises the Annual CottonPatch 3 and 8 Mile Runs. Thanks in part to a gradually increasing wind, no new course records were established this day.

Scott McCaskill from Abilene in the Men's Division and long time club member Sherill Esterling from Coahoma brought home honors in the 8 mile event. Scott has been running competitively for about 5 years and has a marathon PR of 2:38 set at this year's Houston-Tenneco. His weekly total of 70 to 80 miles helps him stay in top form.

Sherill, of course, is well known in WTRC circles being the holder of numerous course records at all distances. In addition to being a game competitor she also has a knack for making friends by way of her running. Sherill is one nice lady!

Good guy Cliff McCurdy (Canadian) raced to the Overall Championship in the 3 mile. Christian Gribble (Big Spring) easily outdistanced the other competitors in the Ladies Division.

What with the Olympic trials a month away, look for a "soft" field at Boston, right? Geoff Smith, of NY Marathon fame, worries that his 2:09:10 won't assure him a place on the British Olympic team. "I'll try for a faster time, probably at Boston."

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NRDC DATA:

The National Running Data Center has just completed a detailed percentile table for 1983 10K road races. To reduce regional bias, they are distributed all across the country. The 32 certified course 10K races had 84,265 finishers.

Several features are evident from the data. The male/female ratio is lower for the western U.S. in general than in the eastern U.S., i.e. the relative number of women running mixed-sex races is higher in the west than in the east. The southeast stands out as having a very small fraction of women runners (19.6%) compared to the northwest and southwest (30.3%).

The fraction of women runners over age 40 is remarkably small in comparison to men runners. Whereas 20.4% of the men's field is over age 40, only 11.9% of the women's field is.

Regional differences in age categories are quite marked. The southwest has an exceptionally high fraction of junior runners, both male- and female. The Mid-Atlantic region has a high fraction of masters runners and, with the New England region, has a very low fraction of junior runners.

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The national age group 75-79, 10K mark is 45:38. It is held by Lou Gregory, who lives in a nursing home in Pensacola, Florida. That is a 7:21 pace!

FOOTNOTES (2)...

TV COVERAGE: Both the womens and mens U.S. Olympic marathon trials will be televised in May.

Also, the actual men and women's Olympic marathon will be televised live this summer. Indeed, the men will start at 5:20P.M. that fits the prime time the best.

Lest we celebrate too much over being able to view it all, read the following. It is reprinted from the Tulsa Running Club Newsletter:

THE RACE ISN'T OVER UNTILL LAST RUNNER'S IN

The guy was a real dude, pure and simple. He had on a swell suit and a tie. His hair was perfect.

He was holding a microphone and speaking into a TV camera. His colleague was standing ther next to him. They were describing a footrace in an Arkansas town.

As they spoke, it was possible to see in the background the finish chutes for the race about which they were talking. As they spoke, dozens of runners could be seen pouring through the finish chutes. In fact, as they spoke, only about the top dozen men had come through the chutes.

The guy with the perfect hair grinned a grin that showed a double row of perfect teeth. "Well, Bob," he said, "the race is over, and (Runner X) won. So that's it from here."

Even as he spoke hundreds more runners could be seen pouring into the finish chutes in the background. In all, about 250 had finished while the guy with the perfect hair and the perfect teeth was proclaiming that the "race is over." More than 1,000 runners were still on the course.

You see, that's the trouble with TV coverage of road races. As pointed out so aptly by Joe Henderson, television wants you and all the other viewers to believe that every road race is a two-man, one woman event. They want you to believe that nothing matters except who finished first. For the most part, as shown in ABC's wretched coverage of the New York City Marathon, television isn't even really very interested in who finished second. That was apparent when ABC totally ignored Geoff Smith, who had run one of the most courageous marathons in history only to be nipped at the finish by the phenomenal Rod Dixon. As fas as ABC was concerned, Smith had somehow "lost" the marathon even though he was running the 26.2 mile distance for the first time in his life. He "lost" in ABC's view, and therefore was unworthy of notice, much less an interview.

FOOTNOTES (3)...

The same viewpoint was expressed in the ignorant comment by the guy with the perfect hair and perfect teeth, that, "Well, Bob, the race is over."

Darrell Royal, speaking about a different sport, once said that "The opera ain't over until the fat lady sings." The guy with the perfect hair and etc., should learn the Galloophmer's Corollary to the Royal Theorem: The race ain't over until the fat guy finishes!

Perhaps runners should be more tolerant of people like the guy with the perfect hair and perfect teeth; after all, guys like him are condemned to a life of being observers rather than participants. If the guy with the perfect hair and the perfect teeth would ever snuck that spiffy suit for a pair of nylon shorts and a singlet he'd probably be more careful about pronouncing races "over" until the participants themselves agree that it's over. The rule is simple: Observers aren't allowed to decide when events are "over" or when they're still in progress; only the do-ers can tell when the finish line has been reached.

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Palm Beach, Florida may be the country's least hospitable place to run. Years ago, the city passed a law against running shirtless. Lately, it has begun enforcement of a 25 year old law prohibiting running on north-south streets.

Seven officers arrested a runner last month. The maximum penalty is one year in jail.
