The 9th Annual Levelland Lope presented a pleasant new course, great looking equipment bags as awards and drawing prizes, and a 4% increase in participation over last year. Eighty runners, joggers and walkers toured a well marked and managed course which wound through neighborhoods, the South Plains College campus and even included a thankfully brief visit to the stockyards.

Mark Manley won the 10K event for the second consecutive year in a time of 36:51 (5:56 pace). Debra Tinnell, Lubbock Coronado's State Track Champion, took women's honors with a 44:17 (7:08 pace). Buddy Hutto was first in the 2 Mile at 11:18 (5:39 pace) and Mandy Malouf edged Dolores Navarro by 5 seconds to win the women's 2 Mile in 13:22 (6:41). Five seconds was also the margin by which Michael Nugent won the Boy's 1 Mile over John Rodriguez in 5:42. Jill Aleman was the first place girl with a 7:01.

Many thanks to Bill Roger for an excellent job in his first year as Race Director, and to volunteers Sally, Mandy and Tedesa Roger, Ronnie Nugent, Kelly Baggett, Jim Hayes, Tony Malouf, Doris Stalcup and Teresa Manley. Thanks also to the Levelland Police Department and the course workers who did a great job with water, safety and directions. All club member volunteers will receive 6.2 miles toward the Challenge Series and Bill will be credited with 12.4 miles as Race Director. Thanks again to all those involved for an outstanding effort and we hope to have an even better 10th Annual Levelland Lope in 1989!

Lope Dope: Those improving last year's 10K times were: April Stein-2:19; Walter Jordan-1:47; David Rodriguez-1:27; Mark Manley-1:10. Kids bettering their '87 times were: Anitra Samarron-1:29; John Rodriguez-1:50; Jill Aleman-1:49; Michael Nugent-1:40; Michael Rodriguez-1:19; Michelle Manley-1:14. There are no comparisons in the 2 Mile as this was the first year for that distance in the Lope. Overall, 10K average times were up from a 44:39 (7:12 pace) average last year to 45:21 (7:18 pace) this year, so if you didn't beat your '87 time, don't feel alone!

Legends of the Lope: Only three grizzled veterans of the '83 10K entered the event five years later: Joe Post (41:30 in '83 and 40:10 in '88), Jim Wilhelm (45:48 in '83 and 46:34 in '88) and Al Grotz (42:12 in '83 and 44:39 in '88). All these guys needed to make the picture complete was a flag, drum and fife. 5K entrants in '83 who returned to a new distance in '88 were: Josie Aleman, Frank Hernandez, Robert Guajardo, Alonzo Mendoza, Jimmy Samarron, and husband/wife duos Prassert and Suparp Punhong and Gonzalo and Jan Ramirez. Jan and Jimmy moved into the 10K, while the others chose the two mile distance.

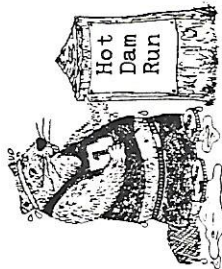
