As the date for the 20th Annual Firecracker Runs, Texas' Oldest Continuous Road Race, quickly approaches, it seems a fitting time to reflect on the pride we can all take in being part of the continuing tradition of the West Texas Running Club. There are few organizations of any type that have continued to serve their memberships for as long or as well as has the W.T.R.C. Consider the longevity of these races: Cottonpatch Runs-16 years; Horseshoe Bend Canyon Spring Frolic-16 years; Buffalo Wallow-15 years; Levelland Lope-8 years; and the Firecracker Runs, Texas' Oldest Continuous Road Race, in its 20th year. Just the names alone attest to the unique character and spirit which the W.T.R.C. brings to each of its events.

From the early days when a stopwatch would be left at the start line and each finisher would clock in the next, to the semi-Star Wars timing devices we use today, there is one factor that has remained constant - that although the names have changed, there have always been people who have felt that it was an important enough thing to have made the sacrifices of time and energy to keep it alive over the years. I'll bet you come up with at least one or two memories or stories about the course, someone you met or ran with, the weather, or something that happened that makes that run special to you. And as you're on the course, take in all of the familiar sights and surroundings and appreciate the security that there is in things that don't change - the hills of Buffalo, that lovely stretch near the finish at Horseshoe Bend, and even the endless fields and furrows at Brownfield.

To our new members - we hope you come to know the sense of continuity and tradition and become a continuing part of it as you return to these places through the years. Long after the trophies have found their way into the closet and the P.R. times are just entries into the log book, the memories of the people and places of the W.T.R.C. will remain as things of true and lasting value.

So with real gratitude to those who founded, nurtured and preserved the West Texas Running Club, those of us involved now hope we can do as well. As the baseball ad says, "The tradition continues . . . the memories are waiting." We hope everyone who can will come out to Brownfield on the 4th to wish the Grande Dame a happy 20th, pick up a great T shirt and help celebrate and preserve the continuing spirit and tradition of the good ol' West Texas Running Club.

# At the races

16th Annual Horseshoe Bend Canyon Spring Frolic Runs  
Designated Event No. 5 of W.T.R.C. Challenge Series  
Slaton, Texas  
May 14, 1988

In what looked like Aspenade, West Texas-style, or a casting call for a re-make of "Easy Rider", the 16th Annual Horseshoe Bend Canyon Spring Frolic Runs were contested amidst some 1,000 motorcyclists on a tour of the canyon from their convention site at Buffalo Lake. It was enough to make you wish you had taken Charlie Daniel's advice and gone to L.A. (or Slaton) via Omaha. Other highlights were Ronnie Nugent's Pottymobile, the use of which would have required the coordination and agility of an Olympic gymnast, and awards adorned with spring flowers in honor of the Sixteenth Annual Spring Frolic Runs.

Warm temps and a stiff wind on the backstretch made the 11 Mile event challenging, to say the least. L.C.U.'s Clay Davis won the long distance event in 1:06:39 (6:03 pace). Brad Raven took second place by 4/100's of a second over the W.T.R.C.'s top man Mark Manley in a time of 1:08:56.5. April Stein kept her W.T.R.C. victory string in tact with a winning effort of 1:26:11 (7:50 pace) in the Women's Open, followed by Barbara Vitalec's 1:41:10. Fast improving Dave Brandolini captured the Men's 2 Mile with an 11:12 clocking (5:36 pace) over Jimmy Samarron's 11:19. The story here is that Dave only began running in earnest back in August. Tracy Baugh was the first of the distaff side to cross the finish line in 13:46 (6:53 pace) followed by Josie Aleman in 14:24.

Cur thanks to Hugh Haynes, Race Director, and his volunteers for their great job, especially with those essential water stops. It was a super run thanks to their efforts.

Frolic Facts: Those bettering last year's 11 Mile times were - April Stein-5:18; Mark Manley-2:45; Ron Key-1:35; Jim Wilhelm-:46. Two milers showing improvement were Tony Aleman-:24 and Frank Hernandez, in his first run as a 50 year old, 8 seconds better than last year.

Bend Bits: Average paces per mile were as follows: 2 Mile, Women 7:34 (7:51 last year); 2 Mile, Men-6:52 (6:41 last year); 11 Mile, Women-8:30 (7:35 last year); 11 Mile, Men-7:28 (7:16 last year). Age division averages were: 2 Mile - Women Under 30-7:36; Women Over 30-7:31; Men Under 20-6:47; Men 20-29-6:54; Men 30-39-6:41; Men 40-49-6:46; Men 50 Plus-7:22. 11 Mile averages were: Women's Open-8:30; Men's Open-6:33; Men 30-39-7:46; Men 40-49-7:58; Men 50 Plus-8:39.

Family Frolics: Husband/Wife combos: Gonzalo and Jan Ramirez and Tony and Josie Aleman in the 2 Mile, and Bill and Barbara Vitalec in the 11 Mile. Father/Son duos were Eugene and Geno Fira in the 2 Mile, George Jury in the 2 and Jeffery in the 11, and Ronnie Nugent in the 11 and Michael in the 2. Tammy Aleman joined Tony and Josie in the 2 Mile to make it a real family affair.

Hugh will be credited with 22 miles in the Challenge Series as Race Director and Super Volunteer Doris Stalcup will be credited with 11 miles.

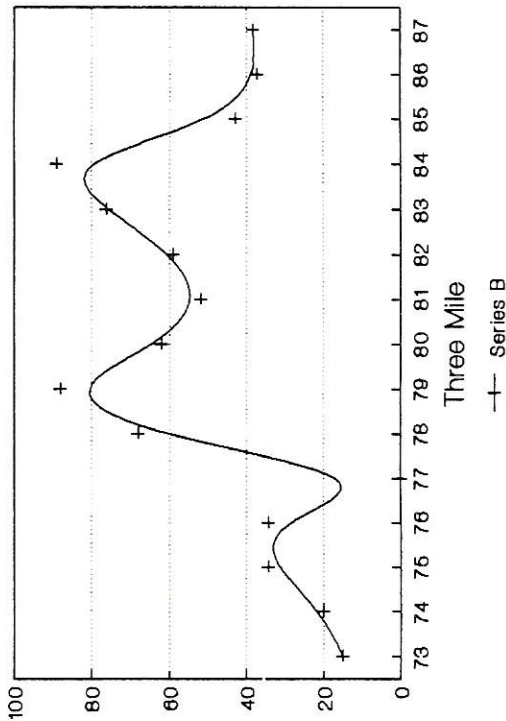

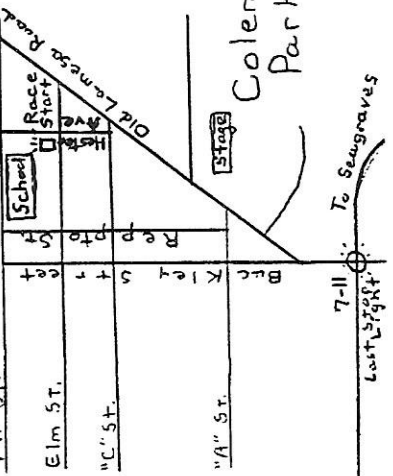
